

3-Way Conferences

Next Term – Wednesday July 28 (School closes at 12noon) and Tuesday August 3 (normal school finish)

For our new parents who have not experienced a 3-way Conference before this is how they run –

- The child, parents/whānau, and the teacher sit together and discuss the child's learning, with the student taking an equal role
- The conferences run for approximately 15 minutes. There should be around 5 minutes for the child to share their learning, 5 minutes for the parents/whānua to gain an understanding of the child's learning, and 5 minutes for teacher feedback.

This is a conversation between child, parents/whānau, and the teacher. It is a conversation about what the students are learning at school and a chance to share some work they are proud of that reflects their learning.

- The role of the parents is to listen to their child, ask questions and encourage the child to expand and explain about their learning.
- The role of the teacher is to facilitate and lead the conversation about the child's learning and prompt the child when needed.
- The role of the child is to share their learning with their parents and reflect on the progress they have made so far this year and set learning goals. Each child will have prepared a sheet to help guide them when discussing their learning and their goals, as well as their mid-year report.
- Naturally with younger children the conversation might be more limited and they may just want to share work they are proud of. But as they go through the school, they should be able to build on past conferencing experiences so that at a senior level, they should be leading the conference and be able to articulate confidently about their learning and reflect on it, setting clear learning goals and understanding the pathway to those goals.

With the end of the term near the board would like to wish all our school whanau a happy and safe holidays.



Wellbeing Modelling Survey




