# Manaia Ridge Pest Control 2021 -Notice

Manaia Landcare will be undertaking further pest control in the Manaia reserve through Spring/Summer 2021/2

The work is to reduce possum, rat and stoat numbers to support our forest and especially the kiwi chicks about to hatch!

**From September 1<sup>st</sup>** a small amount, (up to 200gm), of cereal bait containing Sodium Fluoroacetate (1080) will be placed in the manaia bait station network, any uneaten bait will be removed by late October.

This operation is under the existing Manaia MOH permission.

Bait stations on the lower bait lines and in the vicinity of the public track are excluded - (Double Tap or Ratabate will be used in these areas).

The Manaia summit access track will remain open to the public throughout the operation.

Precautions throughout project period: keep to the marked public track when in the reserve, <u>all other</u> <u>areas are closed</u>.

• keep pets out of the reserve, bait and carcasses are toxic to dogs and cats

watch children at all times

### BETTER START LITERACY APPROACH

The Better Start Literacy Approach, is an integrated classroom literacy programme for Year 0/1 classrooms to support children's early reading, writing and oral language success. It incorporates vocabulary development using quality children's story books, structured teaching of critical phonological awareness skills and letter-sound



knowledge through fun, game-based activities, activities making explicit links to the reading and spelling context, and structured small group reading sessions using the new Ready to Read – Phonics Plus early readers series. The Better Start Literacy Approach follows a phonics scope and sequence that is used in the class and small group reading teaching.

All our primary schools have taken up this professional learning opportunity and will be training with the University of Canterbury.

Kathryn Berkett Tāhu te Ahi 30th September

Whangārei Boys High School Hall

Our guest speaker is Kathryn Berkett and her presentation will focus on the neuroscience of trauma, and responses and strategies to help children and young people impacted by these experiences.

Developing Resilience - 4.00 – 5.30 Teacher/School Session Raising Resilient Children - 7.00—9.00 Parent/Caregiver Session

This workshop will cover how trauma can impact the development of the brain, and how we can increase the 'antidote'= resilience. Both of these concepts, the cause and the cure, will be covered in language that is easy to understand and apply, whilst still being based in research and neuroscience.

- Learning in real-life contexts makes it more relevant.
- Encourages exploration and discovery.
- Builds connections in their learning.
- Encourages their natural curiosity.

- Skills overlap like they would in the workforce.
- Prepares learners for future jobs that may not exist yet.

### DIGITAL CIRCUS

Tracey Kinloch-Jones from Digital Circus worked with many of our schools last week. In the Primary Schools she introduced STEAM by Stealth or STEAM in a book. It is an engaging way of integrating STEAM through the Literacy programme. Children focus on a problem they have identified from the story and look at many ways of trying to solve the problem. Tracey read "The Very Noisy Night" to the children. In these photos some Year 1 children are designing beds big enough for Little Mouse to share with Big Mouse so he won't be scared.
