#### Enviro News

This year Enviro Group split so we can work on two projects at once! Mrs Hunter's group have been focussing on Fern Valley. We have had a planning session where we shared our dreams about what Fern Valley would look like. Then we discussed which of these dreams could be made into reality (some are still being investigated, like a pond)! We surveyed the school and it was decided that we should take a break from hut building in Fern Valley as lots of trees were getting broken, and new ones were not getting a chance to grow. Huts can now be built below the field or in the small triangle of bush by the gate. The group have done a clean up of the bush and fence line to remove rubbish and sports gear! We also learnt a bit about using tree saws and secateurs and we tidied up some branches that were snapped or broken. We have been working on some kitset insect houses to install in Fern Valley to add interest for those using the boardwalk. We have some more elements to this project to work on over the next term and a half so we will keep you updated.







Mr Higgison's group is focussing on the garden area outside the office / admin area, next to the court. The children noticed that the garden is bland, and not very attractive at all. They wanted to brighten the garden up, give life back to it, and hopefully attract creatures back. Two students, Poppy and Florrie, presented the group's idea to the BoT at their last meeting and received great feedback and the thumbs up to proceed. We are now at the point of approaching the wider community to see if there is an individual or group that can support with extending the brick wall to level the garden area.
