Unfortunately, the funding for our schools and kindergartens is not enough for us to give us the time we would like to support all our kids to thrive.

We need to attract and retain educators by ensuring that teaching is a valued and attractive profession.

We are having a review of the use of the school grounds (including classrooms and admin areas) by the Gaidhealtachd. They hire the school each January (from Dec 30th - Jan 8th) each year. 


#### **EPro8 Challenge - Kārearea**




























#### Funky Fish - Fishing and **Diving Competition**
