
**Nina** 1st overall in year 6 girls freestyle and breaststroke, and 2nd overall in backstroke




I heard that the "World famous at Whangarei Heads" camp concert was another hit last night, with amazing performances from the children and the adults.



We have begun our work from the Strategic Plan, looking at Learner Agency. As teachers we are considering ways in which they can encourage more Learner Agency. Some of the ways this happens is allowing the children to choose how to share information they have learned from researching Whananaki, carrying out surveys' to decide what to do on camp, or eat, or who should chose their cabins. In Piwakawaka the play based learning allows for regular learner agency, following the children's passions.

We are having a Teacher Only Day on the 24th April to review our school Curriculum. This day has been awarded to all schools to support them to refresh their curriculum. We will look at the new Aotearoa NZ Histories Curriculum.
