Welcome back to Term 2

Thanks for your continued patience as we work through even more restricted car parking, and road access to open the term. I have discussed our issues with our local Ministry of Education Property Advisor, but also with Hira Gage, the Director of Education for Tai Tokerau. They, like the teaching team, are aware of the challenges this places on you, the parents. We very much look forward to the day that we are able to welcome you all back into the school grounds.

I have been told that it is unlikely we will have a solution this term.

Teacher Only Day - 24th April. Thanks for your support as the staff met to look at the new Social Sciences Curriculum, and as a part of this the new Aotearoa NZ Histories Curriculum. It was wonderful to be able to invest the time diving deeper into both these documents. The teaching team are planning an Inquiry into Matariki for the end of Term 2, and start of Term 3.

The Funky Fishing and Diving Tournament was a huge success towards the end of Term 1. We have raised over \$27k for both the Community Library, and the school. The monies raised will be put aside to contribute to a future playground upgrade. There is a debrief session for the committee next Wednesday at 6pm.

As a staff we are reviewing our Behaviour Management plan and processes, following the Term 1 Inquiry into Anti-Bullying. I will share this with you once it is complete. One outcome has been the suggestion of having a Friendship Seat, for children who need help to find a friend at break times.

Funky Fish Auction - Funds raised for our School Library

On behalf of the school library and our children, I would like to thank all those people who purchased fish at the auction. Without this money we would not be able to purchase books for the school library, as we do not have a budget for this in our school budget each year. Please be assured that the money raised is used only to purchase books for our children, and to fund the upkeep of our online library system, which costs us over \$1000 a year to sustain. We are able to

We are able to purchase the latest books, as suggested by the children and children's librarians, that ensures an emphasis on encouraging reading within our school. We spend upwards of \$5000 per year on books and magazines, which the auction makes possible. There is a bank account dedicated to this fund so that we can have transparency about the way the money is spent.

The community library has its own funding from the council and this money is used to purchase adult books.

Primary Principal's Collective Bargaining Update

You may have seen in the media that primary and area school principals who are NZEI TE Riu Roa members have voted to **stop working with the Ministry of Education and to limit our work hours.**

We have taken this action as we believe it is necessary to highlight the significant issues that we need to address in the current round of negotiations.

We are committed to continuing to lead our schools and to ensure that they are safe, healthy places where students are learning during this time.

Our day-to-day work to do this will continue, but we will no longer be working with the Ministry on their education system work or to introduce or implement new initiatives. As principals we make a significant contribution of time and expertise to this work. There is little additional resource or staffing to support this which has a negative impact on us.

We will continue to meet with our boards.

We will not be available for work or to be contacted before 8am and after 5pm on weekdays, so I will be unable to attend Parent Evenings, and the Funky Fishing Review meeting. This also includes sending or receiving digital communications. Unless it concerns the safety of the school you will not receive DOJO notices messages or emails from me outside of this timeframe.

We also will not be available at all on Saturday, Sunday or public holidays.

We hope to receive an acceptable offer in negotiations and will end the work ban when that happens.

Thank you for all the positive messages I have received that acknowledge the huge role, and workload associated with being a Principal. I do love and enjoy the challenge of the job. Kelly


