Over the December / January holidays we have several blocks being repainted; this includes Tui, the Library, the Art Shed and possibly Kotare Class and the admin area. The Library and Kotare class are also due to have a new roof.

Due to our roll growth a Short Term Classroom is being provided by the Ministry of Education, hopefully by the end of the year. This is to help house classes as a number of blocks are upgraded and a permanent additional class is added over the next couple of years. It was a challenge to find an appropriate space on our site, and not have too big of an impact on the play space for children.

There are also plans to develop an internal car park, near the big rock. We hope to see these pass through the Ministry of Education in the July budget round, and to start to see action on this in the latter part of this year.


Rationale:


The philosophy of Whangārei Heads School is to provide an inclusive and positive education which is fostered in a holistic manner. Student behaviour is viewed as a part of child development that will be modelled and encouraged within partnership between home and school. Inclusive practices and safe environments are of greatest importance to all students.

Staff take a coaching response to any behaviour incident and once the situation is unpacked with the students concerned will discuss strategies to use in the future to prevent repetitive behaviours.

We have implemented the Zones of Regulation Programme across the school. This helps students to develop strategies to identify and self regulate their emotions. By having a common language we can discuss with students how to recognise their emotions and know how they can act to return to the calm state ready for learning or play.

These flow charts explain the process for both minor and major behaviours:

Onerahi Dental Clinic Has Re-Opened!


