This year the teachers have been further developing their understanding of the Digital Technology Curriculum. We have worked with Dani Jolly from DC (Formally Digital Circus), lead by Whaea Tineke in her role as Within School Teacher.

The Digital Technology Curriculum was developed in 2020, supports the teaching and learning of; Computational Thinking and Designing and Developing Digital Outcomes.

Children use Digital technology to explore and deepen their understanding of the world. They can use Digital Technology to communicate, collaborate and create.

We invite you along next term to an Information Evening where we will share the more detail about the Digital Technology Curriculum. Each of the classrooms will be open for you to explore and see how the children have used Digital Technology to enhance their learning.



Earlier this year Ruru constructed 3D cities (Maths - Geometry) and then used the BeeBots to drive through the cities.

BeeBots are just one Digital Technology tool we use to teach simple coding using algorithms.


