E pehea ana koe? How are you? As part of building our cultural responsiveness all staff are building their Te Reo knowledge, with the support of Tracey Morgan. Each week we are given a new phrase to use in class and around the school. I hope you start to hear more Te Reo at home as well.

As part of the National Governments 100 day plan, the "Phones Away" in school policy needs to be ready for the beginning of Term 2. This hasn't been an issue at our kura to date, with very minimal children bringing phones to school. These are usually for our most senior students and are used for whanau to connect after school as they move between different sports and activities. We will be sending home more detailed information around this next week.

We are confident in our pre-existing literacy and numeracy programmes that we are meeting the National Governments second Education commitment to an hour a day in the core learning areas of reading, writing and maths. Our Board and staff are committed to maintaining a rich, balanced curriculum that connects all learning in an authentic and purposeful way for our tamariki. Digital Technology, Financial Literacy (Market Day), Physical Education, Education Outside the Classroom, Health programmes and The Arts are also essential learning areas that help engage all learners. We also value our Environmental Education focus and this year we are embarking on having our first year long inquiry under the umbrella concept of Kaitiakitanga caring for and being a guardian of our environment.


Year 4-8 Swimming Sports!

A big thank you to all the parents who came along and cheered on our swimmers!




2024 School Structure

Messages to children


Courtney has an incredibly busy schedule and a wonderful giving nature. She is very kind to all the kids and whanau who need help or first aid.

PlayGym is a pre-school class for children age 1-4 years exploring new kinds of movement as well as meeting new friends. We climb, swing, balance, hang, jump and play with the aim to start developing our gross and fine motor skills, coordination and senses.

New Entrants & Ninjas

New Extrasts and Ninja humble are our transition programs with parents not corring on the floor during class and where we continue to develop co-ordination, spacial awareness and introduce more gymnastic based elements. Our classes are kept small for this program to provide a safe and welcoming learning environment.

4.15 - 5.15 GymFun Skills 1

Children aged 5-7 years are participating in a gymnastics class, where they work an developing skills on apparatus, physical preparation, strength, and flexibility. The class aims to create a fus and sofe environment for children to learn and interact with peers while working towards badges.
