Dane Higgison has been investigating the options for the new PE Shed, using the monies raised from the Funky Fishing Competition. He has sourced a container to arrive later this term. This will house some new sports equipment, in the centre of the school, making it more easily accessible for everyone. Thanks to everyone who is helping Dane with this project.

As part of the Staff Only Day, we had Kate from Weed Action visit and educate the team on the weeds we have in our school. The team then got busy removing some wild ginger, moth plants and elaeagnus from within the school grounds. Kate and the team hope to be back for our Kaitiakitanga Day, on Wednesday, June 26. It was wonderful to see the team practising Kaitiakitanga and connecting with an important local community group.

The staff also deepened their understanding of the Maths Curriculum, currently being refreshed. They looked at how to deliver explicit teaching, using the new frameworks. They also had a workshop unpacking the Science of Reading, how structured literacy supports children to learn to read. The staff have been implementing Structured Literacy through spelling for the first half of the year, and will move to reading next term.

There is a further MOE planned Staff Only Day in November. We will share these dates with you closer to the time.

Just letting you know how your kiwi that visited the School last year before being release are doing.

Humphries, the male kiwi, has settled on the Martins' pine block at the start of Owhiwa Road. When we caught up with him in November he had grown to 1850g and looked good. He is still in a similar area and now that he is 3 years old he may be settling down with a mate - time will tell.

Te Motu Manu Hine, the female kiwi, has travelled far - from the start of Owhiwa Road to the NRC pine block behind the Old Money factory at the back of Onerahi. We caught up with her today for a transmitter change.

She has grown from 1950g and 121.0mm bill length to 2450g and 135.5mm today and is looking good. Some pics attached

She is 3 years old now so still a bit of filling out to do. If she finds a mate in this area it will be a spectacular success for Kiwi Link and the recovery of a kiwi corridor north of the Whangarei Heads.









