Thank you to all those whanau who participated in our Matariki / Kaitiakitanga Day last week. Whether you came to watch the waiata, or provided shared kai, or helped with Matariki activities or some of the mahi around the school we really appreciate your support. It was a really lovely day, with a great family atmosphere. I loved seeing the children working alongside adult volunteers to care for our school environment.

Thanks to the amazing staff at Whangarei Heads School who have been working behind the scenes to capture mid year assessments, and complete the report writing process. This is an important chance to meet with your child and your child's teacher to talk about learning, what has been achieved this half year, and set some clear goals for the next two terms.

We are making great gains in introducing Structured Literacy across the school and had Pam here from Learning Matters, on Tuesday. Pam is supporting our staff in the implementation of this programme in Ruru, Korora, Kotare and Karearea. I need to congratulate the staff for the hard mahi they have been putting in to understanding the Science of Reading, that sits behind this Professional Learning, as well as learning the strategies for taking a structured approach to Spelling. The next step is to apply this theory to how we teach Reading.

I hope the team has a much earned rest and I look forward to seeing you all back next term, Kelly

Car Parking Etiquette



We are noticing a few cars starting to park **in front of the bollards** on the driveway. This isn't a car parking space, and when you do park here it means you are reversing out through the car park when you leave, where children are also walking.

If possible please can you **reverse into all parks**. This means when you do leave, you are able to see clearly any children in the car park.

Please **keep the disabled carpark free**, unless you have a legitimate reason to use it. We have several children with moonboots and crutches at the moment who benefit from being dropped off in this park by their parents for an easier walk into school.

We do still have some cars that **stop across the car park entrance** to drop their children off. There are more cars moving in and out of the main gates now. Can you please make sure to drop your children near the footpath by Playcentre and away from the bus stop.

Most families collect their children from near the Old Bus Shed, thank you. It is helpful if you are needing to cross the car park to get to your vehicle, if you can **supervise your children**. Staff do help when they can, but we want everyone to be safe.

Finally, **if your child is biking**! Amazing to have so many children doing this, but if you can encourage them to **walk their bike down the footpath from the Play Centre, behind The Big Rock**, that would mean those walking on the path are safe and sound. I hear there have been some near misses!









Emergency Contacts Are yours up to date?









Do we have the correct emergency contact for you? This is the person we will contact to collect your child, if we can't get a hold of you. Send this through to Courtney to update.

Funding call for our Reading Programme

We recently purchased a set of Sunshine readers from the Decodables Series to support our Structured Literacy programme. These books are enjoyable for the kids, are based on high-frequency words with systematic progression for learning the sounds (phonemes) and the letter/s that represent them (graphemes). We do not have further budget set aside this year to buy the next level of books for our students who could really benefit from these. The next set costs \$1,200.00 for a total of 200 books (5x 40 titles for reading groups) across four levels. Ideally, we are needing to purchase the decodable texts for all areas of the kura. 
