I know you are now all aware of the passing of our amazing Josh Gwilliam in a tragic car accident on Monday.

Josh has been a highly valued member of the Whangarei Heads School community since moving into the area approximately 6 years ago; as a parent, friend, and as a member of our Board of Trustees.

Josh served on the Board of Trustees from 2019 until stepping down at the start of this year. During that time he oversaw a number of property projects and then took on the position of co-chair of the Board from 2021-2023.

Josh was a true gentleman in every respect, with a big heart and delightful sense of humour. He had a generosity of spirit that came from his faith, and he is often described by those who were blessed to know him as being "the kindest man on earth".

I really valued his support and wisdom as I took on the role of Tumuaiki of Whangarei Heads School in 2022. He is sadly missed and we as a community wish to send our deepest love and support to his whanau during this time.

I have never been so proud of our kaimahi (staff) as I was this week as they rallied around to support one another in their grief and yet still continue to teach and enjoy our 100 days of learning on Tuesday. You guys are amazing!

Josh's funeral is scheduled to be on Monday. We will remain open and there is no expectation for you to collect your children. We will run a whanau group programme with some staff and allow those who need to go to the Funeral to do so. Some parent volunteers may be used to support staff. Thanks everyone for your understanding and support.



Attendance:

One essential part of all children being able to achieve to their highest potential is to attend school regularly.

The MOE generate a termly report on all schools attendance and it is their aim to have 80% of children attend 90% of the time. (regular attendance). This is a snapshot of our Term 2 attendance: from the MOE Report



We certainly do not want to encourage children to come to school when they are sick - being away for medical reasons is an accepted absence.

Staying home because your child is tired, or having a day off to go to town, celebrate a birthday, visit a family friend are all unjustified reasons to be absent. This accounts for 9% of our Term 2 absences.

However our biggest issue in our attendance is the number of families that take holidays in term time. This is an unjustified absence under MOE policy. 22% of the whanau who were absent in Term 2 were away on holiday. Staff are commenting on how many children are away and for a significant length of time, which does impact on their learning and progress.

To date we have had 40 children absent for a holiday within term time. That is a huge proportion of our school. Almost a quarter or 25% of students have missed school this year for a holiday.

I know that not all learning happens in the classroom and there is huge worth in visiting and connecting with other cultures around the world. I also know that this is especially important for those whanau who come from overseas; it is essential that you go home and reconnect with your culture and language. I also know that prices escalate significantly when planning a holiday within the term breaks.

I am not sure we can do anything to address this issue, except ask you to please be mindful of the impact on learning when you remove students from school for holidays in term time.

Exciting news on Property!

We have more Property work to come. During the term break I was sent an email from MOE Property confirming our Supplementary Request for additional property works:

1. Stage 2 of the Car Park - improving the turn around bay and parking on Whangarei Heads School Road and creating a clear bus stop
2. Admin Block and additional classroom - adding the additional classroom beside Korora (in current admin space) and then extending the office area making it "fit for purpose". We are keeping as much of the original classroom as we can, and the new exterior will be in keeping with traditional.
3. Reclad of the exterior Tui and Piwakawaka classroom block

This is in addition to the planned work to remove some walls next to Ruru class, opening up the office spaces to be break out spaces for this classroom.

At the moment most of these plans are in the concept phase - once something is more permanent I will share with you all.

The dates they require are from November 23 to December 18. If you, or anyone you know, have a holiday home available for this family of four during this period, please contact the school office to be put in touch.




Hatea Hiko - River life by night
