

We have completed the Funky Fishing Review and I presented the findings to our Board at our meeting earlier this week.

We had 44 responses to our survey, which was presented to the community at the Funky Fish event, sent out digitally after the event as a Google Form and then a paper survey was sent home with the children.

There is strong support to continue with the event: These are the results of the Google form: 15 responders.



The paper form showed a similar response with 11/14 indicating they wish the Funky Fish would continue.

People love that the event provides a lovely, whanau and community day out. In addition to providing funds for the school.

There was feedback indicating that those who responded supported the recent changes to make the event more sustainable. There are a lot of ideas around reducing the size and limiting the amount of fish weighed in, promoting Catch and Release more, and giving it more value with better prizes.

There were other ideas around lessening the load on parent volunteers by having other food trucks etc.
