Congratulations and a huge thank you from me, the Kaiako and the WHS Board. Working together we have improved our school attendance rate in Term 2 for the first time! We had 61% of students attend regularly, compared to 49% in Term 2 last year.

Well done to everyone who has made attending school a priority.

2025 WHS BOARD ELECTIONS



Last week nomination forms for any parents who are keen to be part of the WHS Board went home.

We are thrilled that four of the current Board Members are keen to stand again for election; they do such a great job governing our Kura. We are however needing a further Board Member so if you are interested, please get your nomination forms in.

The Board meets twice a term from 6-8.30/9pm in the Whangarei Heads Staffroom. It is a Governance role; meaning that the Board discusses; the Strategic Direction for the next 3 years and progress towards these goals, Student Achievement, Property Development, Health and Safety, Giving Effect to Te Tiriti and Finances.

The poll closes at 4pm on Wednesday, September 10. The highest polling candidates will be elected to the board, and results will be notified to the school community and other affected parties.

WHS SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY LIBRARY CELEBRATION

We will have a Book Parade in the morning, where the children and staff can come to school dressed as their favourite Book Character. SECURITY CAMERAS - AT WHS

Thank you to Brendon Reid and Luke Ogle who have put in place Security Cameras in the school grounds.

We have installed these to protect our school grounds from damage out of hours.

Purpose of camera surveillance

We only collect information for a necessary and lawful purpose (Principle 1). Our purpose for using camera surveillance is to deter and identify anyone:

- entering the school grounds illegally
- engaging in criminal activity, misconduct, or behaviour risking harm to health and safety.

Camera surveillance is not used to routinely monitor students or staff as this breaches the information privacy principles of the Privacy Act (Principles 4 and 10).
