Bring in your old or unwanted books from home and let them be enjoyed by someone else. Receive a token for each book to swap.


Library Presentation, Interview Panel Q&A, followed by afternoon tea - from 2:00pm - please RSVP (details to come).




Science Fair


Karearea Students really impressed the judges of the Science Fair this year with their thorough and interesting investigations! Well done to you all!


















Te Manawa Tahi Community Timetable
