Thanks for your support for our Kaimahi Only Day last week. We spent the day looking at the new Maths Curriculum. We had a robust discussion around possible reasons for our girls achieving less than boys in maths, and all teachers have set themselves a goal to try something different next term. Financial Literacy has had a refreshed focus and we looked at how this is not intergrated into the new curriculum. We also took the chance to review the different ways we are now required to teaching "working form" (algorithms) in all year groups. The new curriculum has brought forward some maths concepts that used to be shared in later years. This is all new learning for everyone, teachers and children included. Thank you to Emily Drake who ably led this day on behalf the staff, synthesising the information she has gained by attending local workshops for Maths Leaders.

The environment project day last week was a wonderful example once again at how we work alongside our core community groups. It was wonderful to have; Backyard Kiwi, Bream Head Trust, Weed Action, Enviro Schools and Riley and Predator Free here to help educate our children.

It has been an incredibly busy term, I hope you and your whanau have a fabulous holiday break.
